Kearney Kayak Tour

Have you ever wanted to see a stormwater outfall up close and personal? If the answer is yes, you're in luck!

On July 18th, 2018 (just one day before our 10th Annual Conference) you can join NeFSMA in a kayak tour of Kearney Canal. This canal is a major drainage way in Kearney. The NPPD Tailrace joins with Turkey Creek which is the beginning of the North Channel of the Platte River.

On the tour, you will see clean-up efforts undertaken by the Kearney Whitewater Association and much of Kearney's stormwater system. The tour will start at 6:00 pm on July 18, 2018 and take about 1.5 hours. No kayak experience is needed. USGS Publishes Bulletin 17C, “Guidelines for Determining Flood Flow Frequency”

Accurate estimates of flood frequency and magnitude are a key component of any effective nationwide flood risk management and flood damage abatement program. In addition to accuracy, methods for estimating flood risk must be uniformly and consistently applied because management of the nation’s water and related land resources is a collaborative effort involving multiple actors, including most levels of government and the private sector. [Bulletin 17C’s Chapter B5 of book 4 \(TM 4-B5\)](#) deals with flood flow frequency analysis at gaged sites using the Expected Moments Algorithm. The use of extreme flood data represented by interval and censored data types, including historical, paleoflood and botanical evidence, is emphasized.

Ryan Joe is the new Stormwater Coordinator for the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ), Water Permit Division. FloodSmart.gov is back

For many years, FEMA's FloodSmart.gov was an important resource on flood insurance information for residents, business owners, floodplain managers and others. While FEMA ended the national marketing campaign (FloodSmart) as of October 2016, they kept up the www.FloodSmart.gov and www.Agents.FloodSmart.gov website. Unfortunately, due to a security breach, they had to turn off access to the website and visitors were directed to www.FEMA.gov/NFIP.

FEMA recently re-introduced FloodSmart.gov with a new look and feel. Here's what they had to say:

The new site takes the best from the interim FEMA.gov site, combined with internal and social science research, website usage research, as well as government regulations and best practices to develop an entirely new, streamlined and customer-centric FloodSmart.gov.

The new site is:

- Modern, Streamlined, Mobile-friendly;
- Customer-centric and follows customer entry-points and journeys;
- Stronger focus on information customers need at various points including purchase and claims;
- Calmer with colors, fonts, and messaging that research shows encourages people to stay longer and learn more.

Next Steps:

The FloodSmart.gov team is already at work on more enhancements to FloodSmart.gov, which will include:

- Agents toolkits
- Agents social media assets
- Agents marketing tools
- Map change toolkits
- Campaign-related landing pages

Some tools from the old FloodSmart.gov have been removed. This was necessary because the old tools no longer met functionality or data security regulations. We're working on bringing even more functional tools to the site soon.
